

ACCOMMODATION



Here are some accommodation tips that you can keep in mind:

- Apply early for on-campus housing for convenience and safety.
- Choose a location with good transport links to your university. Proximity to supermarkets, GP, and recreational facilities is a plus.
- You can also opt for private student accommodation such as: with university living:
 - Arrange your accommodation before you arrive in the UK.
 - Find the room of your choice
 - Prioritise your safety and location near the University
 - Get the guidance of the Support team through the whole process until you settle in.

APPLY FOR A STUDENT VISA

Apply for a visa six months in advance.



For courses over six months, you can arrive in the UK up to one month before the start date. For courses under six months, you can arrive up to seven days before the course starts, as indicated in your CAS letter.

Before booking your flight, ensure you specify your travel date in your visa application. Once approved, you'll receive a letter and UK visa, permitting travel within days from the stated date.

Last Minute Document Checklist

Below is a list of important documents we recommend you bring in your hand luggage while travelling to the UK.

- · Passport with visa
- The letter that accompanied your visa
- Your University offer letter and/or UCAS confirmation slip
- · Your University/University living accommodation confirmation email
- English language test certificates
- Originals (or certified true copies) of any degree certificates or technical qualifications
- Documentary evidence that you have enough money to pay your tuition fees and accommodate yourself while you're in the UK (recent bank statements, proof of scholarship or official financial sponsor letter)
- Any relevant medical certificates showing recent vaccinations
- Chest X-ray report for TB screening
- Medication for ongoing conditions and a doctor's letter
- Plane ticket
- Translations of documents as needed

CASH & CARDS

In the UK, cards are widely accepted. Having a **Forex card** and some **GBP in cash** is recommended when you arrive.

Tip: Exchange currency from your nearest forex dealer and not at the airport to save money on fees, and also to receive better value for your Indian currency.



POST-ARRIVAL



After arriving in the UK, you will first go through **immigration control** where in addition to your passport and visa the following documents and items may be checked:

- Original transcripts and certificates
- Valuables, medicines (with prescription)
- Accommodation confirmation letter (if applicable)
- Medical certificates TB and chest X-ray reports
- Original documentation and letters from the university
- · Copy of bank statements, a sponsor's letter or bank draft
- CAS letter





.Please be aware you may be asked to show all or some of these documents.

Sim Cards

Getting a UK number is advisable as it will facilitate tasks like opening a bank account. You can buy a SIM card easily at any general store or supermarket in town, at airports or railway stations.



Get a SIM that offers cheap international calling, Vodafone, GiffGaff, Lebara, Lycamobile, etc are all trusted networks.




TRAVELLING TO THE UNIVERSITY

Coach

The most economical way to reach your university is by coach, with coaches from main airports running frequently throughout the day. Tickets for these can be purchased at www.nationalexpress.com, www.meaghus.com.or.on.the O



w<u>ww.nationalexpress.com</u>, <u>www.megabus.com</u> or on the Omio App.



Train

All airports have train stations which connect with major cities and tickets can be bought online at www.thetrainline.com or the ticket office at the airport. Tickets will be comparatively more affordable if purchased online in advance.

Taxi

Travelling by taxi is the most expensive option. You can pre-book on the app or call or get black cabs from the airport.



Public Transport

In London, use Transport for London (TfL) at www.tfl.gov.uk and consider the 18+ Student Oyster card (only valid in London).

Outside London, for intercity trains, consider the 16-25 Railcard at www.16-25railcard.co.uk.

Note that all cities have their own transport systems; get acquainted with them. You can use apps like Citymapper and Google Maps, available for both iOS and Android.

Groceries and Essentials

UberEats, JustEat, and Deliveroo in the UK are similar to Zomato and Swiggy. You can order groceries from Tesco, Sainsbury's, Lidl, Morrisons, Aldi, etc. You may also find Indian grocery stores in major cities.



BIOMETRIC RESIDENCE PERMIT

- The Biometric Residence Permit (BRP) holds your biographical details (name, date and place of birth) and biometric information (facial image and fingerprints).
- It shows your immigration status and entitlements while in the UK.
- You will be able to collect your Biometric Residence Permit either from your university or the post office (<u>www.postoffice.co.uk</u>)
- When you go to collect your BRP you must carry your passport/travel document containing the vignette(visa sticker)
- From the end of December 2024, all BRPs will expire, and you will need to transition to an eVisa to reflect your immigration status and entitlements in the UK (Please refer to www.gov.uk/get-access-evisa)

REGISTER WITH A GP (Doctor)

- If you are living in university accommodation, registration with a doctor can be arranged through your hall of residence.
- You can also register with a GP by going to your nearest doctor's surgery (clinic).

Academics


- Get familiar with the academic system, including coursework, exams, and grading.

Daily Living Tips

WORKING IN THE UK





Allowed during vacation and after completion of course

As an international student on a student visa, you can do most kinds of work, but you will be subjected to strict working restrictions regarding the types of employment you can seek in the UK.

You must not:

- Be self-employed
- Engage in business activity
- Enrol with career services
- · Work as a professional sportsperson,
- Work as an entertainer unless you are on a foundation programme
- Secure a permanent full-time job



Tips:

- Reach out to your university's career department for assistance with job searches, CVs, cover letters, and more.
- Volunteering with organizations like NISAU or charities can provide valuable references for future job applications, as employers highly value volunteer work.
- Use LinkedIn to network and establish connections with companies that interest you.
- Explore mentorship platforms for international students studying in the UK.

GRADUATE ROUTE

A Graduate visa gives you permission to stay in the UK for at least 2 years after successfully completing a course in the UK.

Eligibility:

- you're in the UK
- your current visa is a Student visa or Tier 4 (General) student visa
- you studied a UK bachelor's degree, postgraduate degree or other eligible course for a minimum period of time required for the course with your Student visa or Tier 4 (General) student visa
- your university or college has told the Home Office you've successfully completed your course

Apply online at www.gov.uk/graduate-visa.

- Use a valid BRP for identity verification through the 'UK Immigration: ID Check' app.
- In exceptional assurance cases, proceed without a BRP and complete the application form.
- Submit your application by paying the £822 application fee plus IHS fees.
- It's important not to travel outside of the UK, Ireland, the Channel Islands, or the Isle of Man until you receive a decision. Your application will be withdrawn if you do so.
